



Guest speaker:
Marcos Guevara: Immigration Reform

As the Nation talks about separating children from their families at our southern border and in our local community, the conversation about comprehensive immigration reform becomes both more difficult and more inevitable. To help us declutter the topic and find ways that we can act to help resolve the issue, we've invited Marcos Guevara, a member of the local chapter of Voces de la Frontera (a grassroots group that advocates for immigrants, refugees, and low wage workers in Wisconsin), to share some science and some facts about race-relations and immigration. Marcos will also be facilitating a conversation on this important issue.



Sheboygan county has 15 or 20k non-native residents who are not Asian: 6K-12K are eligible for citizenship options. Estimate only 100 DACA.

They are using school enrollment numbers to identify just how many people.

Tools that help us talk about difficult things. Based in cognitive science.

Attributional error - the natural reaction to difference. Where would I have to be in my head to look like that and behave that way?

Confirmation bias - 2 people look at the same set of data and come away with different conclusions.

Cognitive Dissonance - presented with a situation where we're wrong, or we've been duped by the people.. I'm not responsible for making those decisions. Doubling down effect.

These are barriers to having open conversation.

Rampant **Anti-intellectualism** - "You haven't studied it; you aren't the expert..." undermines discourse and useful policymaking.

How do we combat these 4 things? **Mindfulness**. Be hyper aware of thoughts and feelings, "Why am I angry right now?" "Why am I rejecting what I'm seeing?"... It takes a long time to practice mindfulness.

"This is a Fact" Nope, it's complicated. Don't try to argue with facts. Let's make it less about facts and more about the human. What would make you walk 3k miles with a toddler and an infant? Center the human in the situation instead of arguing about statistics.

Separation of families is happening right here in Sheboygan. These are people working in our companies and living in our neighborhoods. Policies in our Sheriff's Department and at the Sheboygan DA right now are terrorizing our fellow people in Sheboygan.

What can we do? Get policies in place to protect people. Call the Sheriff, Cory Roeseler 459-3111. Call the DA, Joel Urmanski 459-3040. Call the schools. Call the county supervisor. Call the chief of police. Ask them to make policies that allow the systems to be freed up for real prosecutorial crimes. Driving without a drivers license should not be treated as seriously as human trafficking.
